## A major award for the *Journal of Pediatric and Neonatal Individualized Medicine* (JPNIM)

Dear Readers,

I would like to share with you the news that, in November 2023, the *Journal of Pediatric and Neonatal Individualized Medicine* (JPNIM) was awarded a “Journal of high cultural value” prize by the Italian Ministry of Culture, through the General Directorate for Libraries and Copyright (with the decree D.D.G. n. 812, 16/11/2023). This is a great achievement as, in the biological-medical field, only a total of 3 journals were awarded by this decree.

### About JPNIM

JPNIM is a peer-reviewed interdisciplinary journal which provides a forum on new perspectives in pediatric and neonatal medicine. The aim is to discuss and to bring readers up to date on the latest in research and clinical pediatrics and neonatology. Special emphasis is on developmental origin of health and disease or perinatal programming and on the so-called ‘-omic’ sciences. Systems medicine blazes a revolutionary trail from reductionist to holistic medicine, from descriptive medicine to predictive medicine, from an epidemiological perspective to a personalized approach. The journal has relevance to clinicians and researchers concerned with personalized care for the newborn and child. Also medical humanities are considered in a tailored way.

### JPNIM Open Access policy

JPNIM provides immediate Open Access to its content on the principle that making research freely available to the public supports a greater global exchange of knowledge. In particular, all content is freely available without charge to the user or his/her institution. Users are allowed to read, download, copy, distribute/print a copy for personal and non-commercial use, search, or link to the full texts of the articles in this journal without asking prior permission from the publisher or the author. This is inspired by the BOAI (Budapest Open Access Initiative) definition of open access.

### JPNIM indexing and archiving

JPNIM is indexed in many databases, e.g. Scopus, the Emerging Sources Citation Index (an index within Web of Science), and DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals).

Long-term preservation is ensured by Portico (a digital preservation and electronic archiving service). Moreover, authors can archive their articles on their personal websites, institutional websites and institutional repositories.

### JPNIM is the official journal of many Societies

JPNIM is the official journal of UENPS (Union of European Neonatal and Perinatal So-

cieties), UMEMPS (Union of Middle-Eastern and Mediterranean Pediatric Societies), and 7 other major national scientific societies from Italy, Greece, Portugal, and Romania: the Portuguese Neonatal Society (*Sociedade Portuguesa de Neonatologia*, affiliated to the Portuguese Paediatric Society), the Hellenic Neonatal Society (Ελληνική Νεογνολογική Εταιρεία), the Hellenic Society of Perinatal Medicine (Ελληνική Εταιρεία Περιγεννητικής Ιατρικής), the Italian-Romanian Pediatric Society (IRPS), SIN INF (Italian Neonatal Nursing Society, *Società Italiana di Neonatologia Infermieristica*), S.I.P.Ped. (Italian Society of Pediatric Psychology, *Società Italiana di Psicologia Pediatrica*), and SIPO (Italian Society of Hospital Pediatrics, *Società Italiana Pediatria Ospedaliera*).

### JPNIM publication

The first issue was published in October 2012, then 22 more issues came out.

To date, 31 Editorials, 226 Reviews (including Invited Reviews), 196 Original Articles, 90 Clinical Cases (sometimes also accompanied by a literature review), 15 Questions and Answers, in addition to Interviews and Correspondence, have been published. Also of note is the publication of 70 Proceedings from International Congresses and 12 Proceedings from National Congresses.

At the top of the contributing countries are, in descending order: Italy, Portugal, the United States of America, India, Greece, Turkey, Belgium.

### JPNIM website views

In 2023, on JPNIM website only (i.e., not considering databases and repositories in which JPNIM articles are also listed), the views of article abstracts plus the views of article full texts were around 346,000.

### JPNIM metrics

Regarding JPNIM metrics, CiteScore 2022 is 0.8 according to Scopus; H5-index (2018-2022) is 10 according to Google Scholar; CiteScore rank 2022 is 29<sup>th</sup> in Pediatrics, Perinatology and Child Health according to Scopus.
